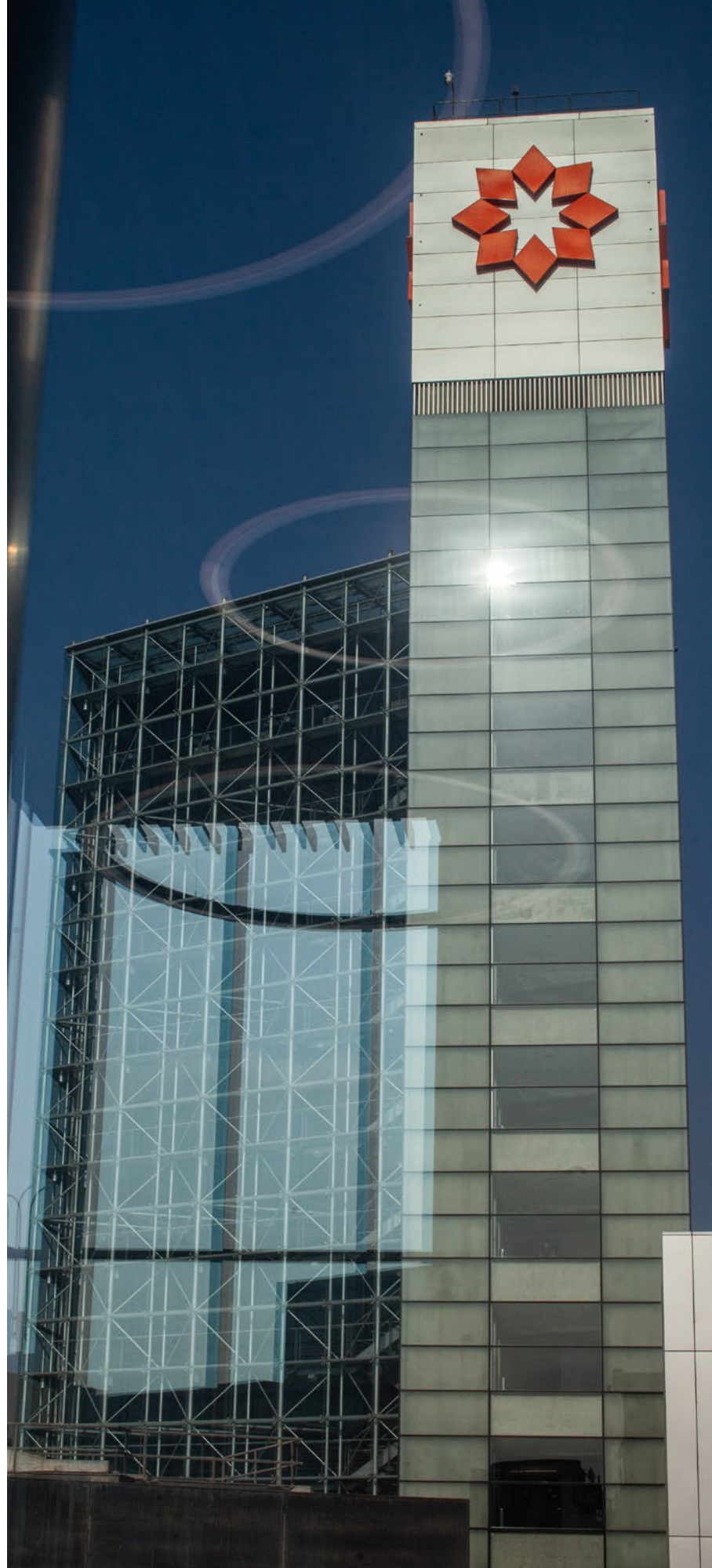

STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Languages	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Spanish. English: Available courses in Management, Economics, Engineering, Marketing, and International Business.
Spanish Language Requirements	While an official language certificate is not mandatory, we strongly recommend a B2 level of Spanish proficiency (written and spoken).
Exchange Students	Undergraduate and graduate students (undergraduate courses may be required).
Eligibility	Students must be selected and nominated by their home university to participate in the student exchange program.
Number of Exchange Students	As established in the bilateral agreement. The number may be increased upon prior coordination with Universidad de Lima.
Maximum Exchange Period	Students may participate in the exchange program at Universidad de Lima for a period of up to one academic year.

LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE

This will be submitted within 15 days after receiving the complete application documents.

STUDENT IMMIGRATION STATUS PROCESS

Students are required to submit the following documents at least **60 days prior** to arrival in Lima:

- Immigration processing fee payment confirmation
- Legalized or apostilled affidavit of financial solvency
- Legalized or apostilled affidavit confirming no criminal, police, or judicial record
- Legalized or apostilled power of attorney granting Universidad de Lima authorization to manage immigration procedures

Universidad de Lima will provide detailed instructions once the application process is complete.

ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS

Once the immigration status has been approved, students must submit the following additional information to complete the process:

- Round-trip airline tickets for a maximum stay of 180 days
 - International medical insurance for the entire duration of the trip
 - Address of accommodation in Lima

ACADEMIC SEMESTER INFORMATION

Universidad de Lima has two regular periods:

- First semester: April to July
- Second semester: August to December

Undergraduate programs typically span 10 academic levels, with two levels taken per year.



COURSE WORKLOAD

3–4 hours per week (class hours).
Attendance is mandatory.



CREDIT SYSTEM

One Ulima credit is equivalent to twenty hours of classes. The semester has 14 weeks of classes.

Each course is worth 2–6 Ulima credits, depending on its complexity. Please note that Ulima credits are not the same as ECTS credits. Some European institutions apply the following equivalence: 1 Ulima credit = 1.5 ECTS.



GRADING SYSTEM

The grading system ranges from 0 to 20. Any grade below 11 is considered a failing grade.

ISSUANCE OF TRANSCRIPTS

Transcripts are sent to students about one week after the end of the semester.



ENROLLMENT

Students will be assisted with course selection during the registration process. Changes are permitted only through the first week of classes.

HEALTH INSURANCE INFORMATION

Mandatory Health Insurance

Before arriving in Peru, students must submit a copy of their international health insurance policy issued in their home country. Coverage must remain valid for the entire exchange period, from the date of arrival in Lima through the date of departure.

The policy must include outpatient care, hospitalization, and repatriation of remains, with direct billing available at private clinics in Peru. Coverage dates must be clearly indicated on the policy.

If necessary, students are responsible for requesting from their insurance provider a list of affiliated private clinics in Peru.

STUDENT IMMIGRATION STATUS INFORMATION

Universidad de Lima processes Temporary Student Immigration Status (six months) or Resident Student Immigration Status (one year) for exchange students through the Superintendencia Nacional de Migraciones (Peru's National Immigration Authority).

To begin the process, students are required to submit the following documents at least 60 days prior to arrival in Lima:

- Immigration processing fee payment confirmation
- Legalized or apostilled affidavit of financial solvency
- Legalized or apostilled affidavit confirming no criminal, police, or judicial record
- Legalized or apostilled power of attorney granting Universidad de Lima authorization to manage immigration procedures

Document Submission Requirements

All submitted documents must comply with the following:

- Legalized or apostilled: Documents must be officially validated in the student's country of origin.
 - If the country of origin is a signatory to the Hague Convention, documents must be apostilled by the competent authority of that country.
 - If the country is not a signatory, documents must be legalized by the Peruvian Consulate in the country of origin.
- Official translation into Spanish. Any document issued in a language other than Spanish must be officially translated into Spanish. If the apostille or consular legalization is issued in another language, it must also be translated.
- All translations must be completed by a certified Peruvian public translator.

Upon completion, students will be notified when their immigration status is ready for collection at the corresponding Peruvian embassy or consulate in their country of origin. To find the Peruvian consulate assigned to your country, visit: <http://www.consulado.pe/paginas/Inicio.aspx>

IMPORTANT:

- Temporary Student Immigration Status is granted for an initial period of 90 days and may be extended for an additional 90 days. The maximum authorized stay is approximately 180 days.
- Immigration processing conducted by Universidad de Lima is contingent upon the timely submission of all required documentation. Students are responsible for ensuring that documents are complete and submitted by the established deadlines.
- Airline tickets should be purchased only after immigration status approval has been confirmed. Purchasing tickets prior to approval is not recommended.
- Students who plan to extend their exchange for an additional semester must promptly notify uce_intercambio@ulima.edu.pe to initiate the immigration status renewal process.

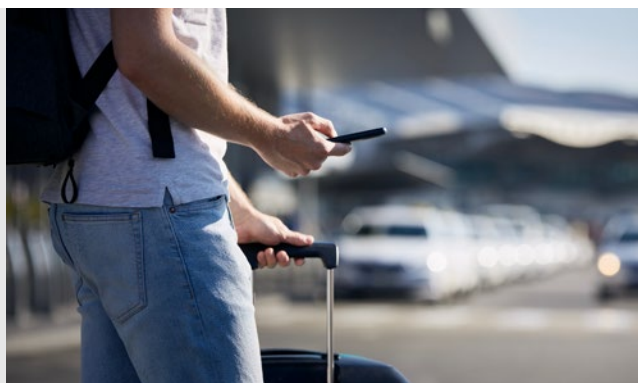
ACCOMMODATION

On-campus housing is not available at Universidad de Lima. Exchange students may choose from accommodation options recommended by the Internationalization Office. Assistance is available upon request.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

AIRPORT PICKUP SERVICE

Complimentary airport pickup is available on the student's scheduled arrival date. The University will contact students approximately two weeks prior to arrival to coordinate this service.



PALS PROGRAM

Each international student will be supported before and during their exchange by a PALS partner, who will assist with their cultural and academic integration. The program includes help with course registration and guidance on using the Ulima App and the Blackboard platform.

Objectives:

- Support exchange students in adapting to academic life and the Ulima campus.
- Provide an opportunity for both students to practice a foreign language.
- Promote cultural exchange by encouraging students to learn about different languages, customs, and traditions.
