### Professional profile:

Graduated from the Faculty of Law of Charles University (Doctor of Law in 1989). From 1991 to 1992 he studied at St. Edmund Hall, Oxford. In the late 1990s, he was Head of the Chancellor's Office at Charles University. After receiving his Ph.D., he habilitated as an associate professor of Czech and Czechoslovak legal history in 1999. Subsequently, in 2005 he was awarded a professorship. He was first a vice-dean, then for two terms from 2014 to 2022 also dean of the Faculty of Arts of Charles University. He is the author of many monographs and cited works in legal history.

- 2014 to 2022 - Dean of the Faculty of Law at CU
- 1999 to 2014 - Vice-Dean of Faculty of Law, CU
- 1996 to 1999 - Head of the Rector's Office
- from 1995 - successively assistant professor, associate professor and professor at the Faculty of Law, CU

- 1999 - Associate Professor (Czech and Czechoslovak legal history, Charles University)

### Teaching activity:

At the Faculty of Law of Charles University, he has long been lecturing on the historical foundations of Czech law and compulsory elective courses focused on Czechoslovak legal history and the development of English law.

### Foreign internships:

The most important recent foreign internship was a lectureship at the University of San Francisco Law School (USA) during the autumn semester in 2014.

### Publication and creative activities:

He is the author or co-author (mostly with Assoc. Prof. Jan Němeček) of 20 monographs and nine editions of documents on the history of Czechoslovak foreign policy and the Czechoslovak government-in-exile in 1939-1945, author of more than 100 scientific articles and teaching texts.

### Popularization activities:
