Learn to construct persuasive and well-structured proposals that effectively communicate the significance and impact of your research, with specific tips on ERC applications.

Acquire skills for preparing detailed and realistic proposals that comply with funder guidelines to enhance your proposal's competitiveness.

About the speaker:

Professor Miri Yemini is a full Professor of Education in the Faculty of Education for Science and Technology at Technion. There, she leads a research group focusing on global dimensions of education. The research group conducts multidisciplinary studies aimed at understanding policy-making processes in the field of education, examining the practices of various stakeholders in educational systems worldwide, and proposing approaches to enhance educational practices within and beyond schools. Between 2023 and 2028, Professor Yemini is leading a large international research funded by the European Research Council, aiming to study youth activism in diverse contexts, including climate crisis and human rights. Research within the group belongs to the fields of comparative education and sociology of education.
